our planned projects in Mayo: a timeline





Mayo Generating Station Relicensing Project

We need a water use licence to generate electricity at the Mayo Generating Station. Our current water use licence expires on December 31, 2025. To continue to generate electricity and provide Yukoners with renewable electricity, we are seeking to renew our water use licence.



Mayo A Hydro (MH0) Rockslide and Surge Tank

The rock slope above the Mayo A Plant needs to be stabilized to ensure continued safe operation of the plant into the future. The surge tank, located on the rock slope, is end of life and needs to be replaced.



Wareham Dam Spillway Project

The Wareham spillway is a critical component of the Mayo Generating Station. When there is too much water to use to generate electricity, it flows down the spillway and into the Mayo River. The spillway needs to be repaired or replaced. We completed temporary repairs in 2024 and are now working on a permanent solution.




Mayo A Plant Renewal

The Mayo A Plant has been in service since the early 1950s and is nearing its end of life. To continue operating safely into the future, it requires an upgrade. Options for the plant, including the building and its equipment, will be considered.



Mayo Lake Control Structure (MLCS) Replacement

The MLCS enhances the natural storage of Mayo Lake. It was recently assessed and found to be in poor-to-fair condition. We need to replace the structure so we can continue to safely generate electricity at the Mayo Generating Station.
